[Note 2] Level 5 Tort Law Examination can only be taken by Year 1 students who are also taking all three Level 4 modules under the Graduate Entry Route, namely the 'Fast Track Route'. Year 1 students who take the Fast Track Route will have to sit all 4 exams at the first attempt in the May/June assessments.

Preparation Courses Structures

Main lectures run from October to January and revision lectures run from March/April. There will be lectures focusing on exam preparation and writing skills, and students will have an opportunity to submit written work in advance of these lectures. Mock Exams will be held in February/March.

Our London U LLB preparation courses are not limited to University of London LLB students. Students who are attempting English Law or comparable examinations or those who are interested in studying specific modules are also welcome.


