PRC Consular Law and Practice is designed to provide participants with a comprehensive understanding of the legal framework and practical aspects governing consular affairs in the Peoples Republic of China (PRC). This program delves into the intricacies of consular law, exploring the rights, responsibilities, and procedures associated with consular services provided by the PRC government to its citizens abroad. Participants will study the key elements of the legal framework governing consular affairs in the PRC, including relevant international treaties, conventions, and domestic legislation.

Understanding PRC's consular practices in Hong Kong SAR and abroad is particularly important for practitioners in law, business, journalism, policy research and consultation, and employees in international and non-government organisations. It is also valuable for government officials such as those work in the Department of Immigration or in the Hong Kong Economic and Trade Offices.

- an associate degree or a higher diploma awarded by a recognised post-secondary institution.

This course aims to introduce participants to the Constitution of the Peoples Republic of China, the Basic Law of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, the Law of the Peoples Republic of China on Safeguarding National Security in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, and the Safeguarding National Security Ordinance. The course will provide a comprehensive overview of the national constitutional framework, explain the constitutional status of the Special Administrative Region established under the Constitution and by the Basic Law, elucidate the concept of national security, and discuss the significance of safeguarding national security in Hong Kong Special Administrative Region. Relevant knowledge helps stakeholders understand the application of the concept of national security in daily life.

The Hong Kong national security law, officially the Law of the People's Republic of China on Safeguarding National Security in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, is a piece of national security legislation concerning Hong Kong. The National Security Law took effect at 11 pm on 30 June 2020 upon gazettal in the HKSAR. The National Security Law has 6 chapters and 66 articles, which criminalise four types of acts: secession, subversion, terrorist activities, and collusion with a foreign country or with external elements to endanger national security. This course aims to provide an accurate understanding of the relationship between the National Security Law and the Basic Law as well as the enforcement mechanisms to safeguard national security.
